**EXPLANATORY GUIDELINES FOR AN APPLICATION FOR AN IMPORT PERMIT FOR ARMAMENTS AND RELATED PRODUCTS**

1. The purpose of an Import Permit is to regulate the transfer of conventional arms into South Africa.
2. Applications are to be submitted in English in the prescribed Form IMP 3.1 and shall be completed in either typescript or in capitals in ink.
3. The Directorate Conventional Arms Control shall not accept any form or format of application other than Form IMP 3.1.
4. Products and services must in all cases be stipulated individually. No applications for generic product groups will be considered.
5. Applications are to be forwarded to the Directorate Conventional Arms Control by a secure means. Facsimile applications will not be accepted.
6. Where applicable an Import Permit application must be accompanied by an application for an End User Certificate.
7. The Minister of Defence publishes armaments and related products that require an Import Permit in the Government Gazette.
8. Import Permits are valid for a period of six (6) weeks after the date of Import submitted in the application. The applicant may apply for an extension to the Import Permit if necessary.
9. The National Conventional Arms Control Committee through the Minister of Defence may at any time cancel or suspend an Import Permit.
10. An Import Permit is not transferable and the products stated therein may only imported by the parties listed therein to the stated destination.
11. All armaments must be identified through either serial numbers, lot numbers in the case of ammunition, chassis or Vehicle Identification Numbers (VIN), in the application documentation.
12. If available, the Waybill and / or Letter of Credit should be attached to the application.
