PROTECHNIK HOSTS SCIENTISTS FOR ANALYTICAL CHEMISTRY COURSE

rotechnik Laboratory, a division of Armscor, hosted 25 scientists from 13 African countries during the 15th Annual Analytical Chemistry Course (ACC), that took place from 1 – 12 September 2025 at Technopark in Centurion. The following countries were represented: Burundi, Cote d'Ivoire, Gambia, Ghana, Kenya, Malawi, Mauritius, Nigeria, South Africa, Tanzania, Uganda, Zambia and Zimbabwe.

The course, offered under the auspices of the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW), forms part of ongoing efforts to strengthen Africa's capacity in implementing the Chemical Weapons Convention. The theme, "Strengthening Chemistry Amongst African State Members", underscores the importance of regional collaboration and knowledge-sharing.

Scientists got an opportunity for hands-on training in areas such as sample preparation and verification of chemical warfare agents and their degradation products, use of analytical instruments and software, method validation and basic laboratory equipment maintenance. The course covered key topics that included gas chromatography, toxic industrial chemicals, mass spectrometry and the detection of chemical warfare agents and their degradation products.

"We are honoured to host our fellow African scientists at Protechnik Laboratories, a hub of expertise and innovation", said Advocate Solomzi Mbada, CEO of Armscor. "This gathering not only enhances scientific proficiency but also deepens relations among OPCW member states. Armscor remains committed to supporting initiatives that contribute to Africa's stability and development."

Adv. Mbada added: "Each year, scientists return to their countries better equipped to promote the peaceful regulation and application of chemistry. We trust that the knowledge gained here will be shared widely to strengthen the capacity of designated laboratories across the continent."

Protechnik Laboratories, part of Armscor's Research and Development business unit, is a multidisciplinary facility specialising in chemical and biological defence research. It provides advanced analytical services for the detection of highly toxic and prohibited agents and supports protective solutions such as testing masks and specialised materials.






ARMSCOR DEMONSTRATES ITS CAPABILITIES AT THE RAIL CONFERENCE

n an effort to demonstrate its capabilities and contribute towards the developmental agenda, Armscor proudly participated in the Southern African Rail Association (SARA) Conference and Exhibition, held from 26 - 29 August 2025 at the Sandton Convention Centre. The four-day event held under the theme "Transporting Africa Forward: Accelerating Rail Growth to Boost Mobility and Economic Opportunity across Africa" brought together policymakers, industry leaders and stakeholders from across the globe, offering a platform for knowledge exchange, networking and collaboration on advancing rail development across the SADC region. Discussions focused on rail policy, infrastructure, rolling stock signalling, financing and corridor logistics, with special attention given to innovation and sustainable development.

Armscor's participation

Two divisions represented Armscor at this year's exhibition:

- · Institute for Maritime Technology (IMT): showcased the Ultrasonic Broken Rail Detector (UBRD), a system designed to check for the integrity of the railway line by looking for rail fractures and rail breaks. This is a cuttingedge safety solution designed to enhance rail infrastructure monitoring and reliability. It also lowers the probability of derailments and reduces the cost of unscheduled downtime due to rail breaks.
- AB Logistics: presented its general freight and forwarding capabilities, highlighting integrated logistics services that support efficient and reliable transportation

solutions across the continent. AB Logistics is known for providing efficient services such as customs formalities, imports and exports control, compliance requirements, shipping route development, road haulage transport that includes explosives, aircrafts and air chartering.

Strategic Impact

Armscor's presence underscored its role in contributing to Africa's transport and logistics ecosystem. By showcasing technological advancements and operational capabilities, the Corporation demonstrated its commitment to strengthening rail safety, efficiency and connectivity, aligning with continental goals of boosting economic growth and mobility.

Looking ahead, the event not only created opportunities for strategic partnerships but also positioned Armscor as a forward-looking enabler of innovation in the rail sector. Engagements with stakeholders opened doors for collaboration on infrastructure development, technological solutions and cross-border logistics initiatives, all vital to driving Africa's transport agenda forward.

IMT DISPLAYS DECADES OF MARITIME SCIENTIFIC EXCELLENCE

he Institute for Maritime Technology (IMT), a division of Armscor, successfully hosted its *Show and Tell* event on 19 and 22 September 2025 in Simon's Town, marking decades of maritime scientific and engineering excellence.

The programme started with a dedicated session to senior officials and key stakeholders who were given an exclusive platform to engage with IMT's leadership and technical experts. This provided an opportunity to witness first-hand innovations, take part in strategic discussions and gain insights into the technological future of South Africa's maritime defence. The second part of the programme on 22 September was designed as an Open Day for junior members of the South African Navy Fleet at Naval Base Simon's Town. This interactive session introduced the younger generation of naval professionals to IMT's work and offered them a platform to interact directly with scientists and engineers on key projects.

This event reflected not only the proud legacy of the IMT but also its commitment to shaping the future of maritime defence innovation. Across both days, the facility showcased its scientific and engineering achievements spanning nine domains, while also highlighting the unique capabilities of its world-class facilities such as the tank testing infrastructure. These demonstrations created an environment for knowledge exchange where current maritime challenges and potential solutions were discussed in depth.

Among the highlights of the event was a live at-sea demonstration of IMT's latest Unmanned Surface Vehicle, which showcased the institute's ability to develop, test and evaluate advanced technologies in operational conditions. Seagoing support facilities were also presented, demonstrating how IMT ensures rigorous evaluation of technology demonstrators in real-world environments.

The Show and Tell event once again reinforced IMT's role as a key strategic partner to the South African Navy and the broader maritime community. It celebrated the institute's achievements over the past five decades while looking firmly to the future, ensuring that South Africa remains at the forefront of maritime defence technology. Both engagements were regarded as resounding successes, fulfilling the objectives of the Show and Tell initiative and reaffirming IMT's reputation as a leader in scientific and engineering innovation.

s part of its ongoing Stakeholder Engagement Strategy, Armscor welcomed Warrant Officers the South African National Defence Force (SANDF) to its headquarters in Erasmuskloof on 4 July 2025.

The visit formed part of the Officers' development course and provided an opportunity to familiarise them with key organisations in the South African Defence Industry that enable the SANDF to fulfil its mandate effectively. Armscor, as the acquisition agency for the Department of Defence, offered insight into its long-standing partnership with the SANDF and the service level agreements in place.

The programme introduced participants to Armscor's core business, value proposition, capabilities and facilities. After the welcoming remarks by Ms Segomotso Tire, Executive Manager: Business Development and Industry Support, Mr Yamkela Gungqwa, Business Development Manager at Armscor, in his presentation reflected on the Corporation's history, its evolution and its pivotal role in shaping South Africa's defence landscape. He outlined the product life–cycle from user requirements to the disposal of obsolete defence matériel and explained how various Armscor departments work together to ensure products and services meet operational needs.

Mr Gungqwa also shared updates on current research and development initiatives, including flagship projects

such as the Ultrasonic Broken Rail Detector, Beach Barrier System and underwater sensors, noting how some innovations have transitioned from defence applications to civilian use. He further presented on all Research and Development facilities, their capabilities, products, services and their value—add to the SANDF operational readiness. "Our primary source for solutions is the local defence industry," he said. "The advantage of partnering with Armscor is our ability to facilitate government-to-government contracts." He explained the acquisition process emphasising on the cradle to grave concept and positioning Armscor as a one-stop centre for defence and security solutions.

He further emphasised the role of Armscor's Quality Department in ensuring compliance with industry standards and the clients' expectations: "Our mandate is to ensure that soldiers on the ground can execute their missions. Any requirement entrusted to us must be delivered with the highest quality and the necessary support," he concluded.

The session ended with a Q&A segment, allowing Warrant Officers to gain clarity on Armscor's offerings and how these support their daily operations and responsibilities. In this session, he added that Armscor is there to ensure that SANDF is well equipped and the end-users are key in ensuring that any solutions provided guarantee mission success at all times.

FUTURE COMBAT LOGISTICIANS COMPLETE INTENSIVE TRAINING

Vice Admiral Mkhonto also highlighted key achievements within the Logistics Division, including the launch of Project ZIGIZA and the SAFI Turnaround Strategy, as well

as the formalisation of the Disaster Emergency Strategic Reserve with COGTA. His address emphasised the necessity of curriculum reforms, calling for the modernisation of the Combat Logistics Training Simulator in collaboration with CSIR and integrating programmes like Exercise VUKUHLOME into the training pipeline to ensure readiness for contemporary multidomain operations.

A recurring theme throughout the evening was the burden and privilege of officership. Furthermore, Vice Admiral Mkhonto reminded graduates that leadership extends beyond skills and procedures; it is about setting the standard. "Our people watch us more than they listen to us," he noted. "Your punctuality, your attention to detail, your tone of voice, these become the invisible manual your team follows."

The dinner celebrated not just individual achievement, but also collective progress. As graduates received their commemorative gifts, courtesy of Armscor, there was a palpable sense of unity and shared purpose. The Department of Defence School of Logistics has reaffirmed its status as a national institution of excellence, producing officers equipped with both the technical expertise and the ethical grounding necessary to serve with distinction. As Vice Admiral Mkhonto concluded: "May your journey ahead be marked by quiet excellence, resolute leadership and a legacy of mission-first logistics support."

- By establishing networks, mentorship programmes and skills development pipelines to equip women especially young entrants to the industry with the technical expertise, leadership skills and confidence to succeed.

In conclusion, it was agreed that there is a need for women to support one another in the battle for empowerment and emancipation. Furthermore, opportunities should be created for young women to unleash their full potential.
